Bottom Line

Pray when you're under temptation.

Don't try to face or stand up to temptation on your own. Why would you try to tackle on your own what you could face with the power of God?

Scripture

Matthew 6:13, 1 Corinthians 10:12-13

Icebreaker

Best/Worst: This is a simple icebreaker to implement in your group. Ask each person to share their best and worst moments from the previous week. The entire activity should not take longer than 10-15 minutes, depending on how large your group is. This is an easy one to use, and it gives you good feedback on how the people in your group are doing in a general sense.

This is great for any group, but the longer the group has been meeting, the more honest the answers will be. If you use this with a group of people who do not know each other well, the answers may be short and surface-level. Persevere, and people will become more comfortable with one other.

If people are not engaging with the question, you can prompt them with follow-up questions to help them remember what they did during the week. It can also help if you initiate the icebreaker by answering the question first, giving everyone else time to think about their answers.

Exploration

Application
