Responsiveness. Being anointed doesn't mean you're perfect. David demonstrated his anointing when he repented after his sin with Bathsheeba. The difference between David and Saul is that David responded in repentance when confronted with his sin. Saul went deeper into sin and insecurity. Being anointed doesn't mean you have to be perfect, but you had better be responsive.

ICEBREAKER

Line Up

This game requires your group to line up in any determined order without speaking to one another. For example, ask your group to line up in order of their birthdays, starting with the earliest in the year. Or have them line up in descending birth order, from oldest to youngest. The prompt could be anything, as long as there is something they can order themselves by. The game is engaging because they have to figure out how to line up correctly without talking.

Tip: This game gives insight into how people operate. You will learn how the people in your group solve problems, who takes a leadership role and who does not, and how different personalities respond to the game. This icebreaker can launch a study about how to reply to obstacles, or topics like that. It can also help your group discover how they behave as a group and how they can grow as a group. It's an excellent self-awareness tool.
