A Guide for Community Group Leaders

As you embark on leading your group through the SERVE 2024 series, this guide is designed to be a comprehensive resource to aid you in facilitating meaningful and impactful discussions as well as helping your group plan and execute a service project in your community during the SERVE week. Here's how to make the most of it:

Familiarize Yourself with the Material.

Before each session, take some time to read through the week's content. This includes the scripture readings, teaching points, discussion questions, and the challenge for the week.

Lead with Prayer.

Begin each session with prayer. Ask for the Holy Spirit's guidance as you dive into the Word and discuss its application.

Facilitate Open Discussion.

Use the discussion questions as a starting point to encourage open and thoughtful dialogue. Remember, there are no 'right' answers; the goal is to foster a deeper understanding and personal application of the scriptures. NOTE: You're not expected to cover every discussion question each week. Feel free to skip around the material as needed. Don't forget to leave enough time to discuss and your group's project!

Encourage Personal Reflection.

The "Make it Personal" section is designed for individual reflection. Give group members time to contemplate and share how the week's theme applies to their lives.

Use the Leader Lifter Video. The provided video link for each week is a valuable resource. It is designed specifically to help you as a leader think about the material. It is coaching for you!

Guide the Group in the Weekly Challenge.

This section is designed to help you plan a SERVE project with your group. You should spend a significant part of your CG meeting working on this part. At the end of the meeting, participants have a space to write down their to-do list before the next meeting. Do your best to make sure everyone has something they can do to contribute to help make your SERVE project a success. Don't forget to check out the SERVE page on our website (clifec.com/serve). Adapt to Your Group's Needs.

Feel free to tailor the discussions and activities to fit your group's unique dynamics. The guide is a framework, but the Holy Spirit can lead you in the direction your group needs to go.

Keep a Focus on Service.

The overarching theme of this series is service. Keep steering the conversation towards how your group can serve the community and embody Christ's love through action. Remember the end goal of this study is that you and your CG will plan and execute a SERVE project.

End with Prayer.

Conclude each session with prayer, focusing on the week's theme, any shared concerns, and prayers for the service project you are planning and implementing.

Week 1: Understanding Servanthood

This week, we delve into the heart of servanthood, guided by Jesus Christ's example. Reflect on how servanthood is portrayed in the Bible and consider how you can embody Christ's example in your daily life.

Weekly Review Questions

What has God been doing in your life lately? Are you excited about it, or does it make you anxious?

What stood out to you in the devotional material, or your Bible study this week?

Scripture Reading for the Week:

- Matthew 20:26-28
- Mark 10:43-45
- John 13:12-17

Discussion

Today, we're exploring the concept of servanthood as taught and exemplified by Jesus. In a world where greatness is often measured by power and authority, Jesus presents a radically different view. Let's dive into the scriptures to understand His teachings on true greatness and leadership.

Matthew 20:26-28: Redefining Greatness

Read the Passage:

"It shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be your slave, even as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Reflection: In these verses, Jesus is responding to the disciples' dispute about who would be greatest in the kingdom of heaven. He turns their understanding upside down by stating that greatness comes from serving others, not from being served.

Discussion Questions:

How does Jesus' definition of greatness differ from the world's perspective?

Can you think of a situation where serving someone else made you feel more fulfilled or 'greater' in a spiritual sense?

How can we apply this teaching in our personal, professional, and spiritual lives?

Mark 10:43-45: Leadership as Servanthood

Read the Passage:

"But it shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Reflection: Here, Jesus emphasizes that true leadership is about serving others selflessly. He presents Himself as the ultimate example, serving humanity to the point of sacrificing His own life.

Week 1: Understanding Servanthood

Discussion Questions:

How does this teaching challenge the conventional view of leadership?

In what ways can we model this servant leadership in our own communities?

Discuss examples of when you've seen this type of leadership in action.

John 13:12, 14: The Ultimate Act of Humility

Read the Passage:

When he had washed their feet... "If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet..."

Reflection: This passage describes Jesus performing the humble act of washing His disciples' feet, a task typically done by servants. This act symbolizes service, humility, and the cleansing power of Christ.

Discussion Questions:

What does Jesus washing the disciples' feet teach us about humility and service?

How can we incorporate this lesson of humble service into our daily interactions?

Share a time when you experienced or witnessed an act of humble service. How did it impact you or others?

Make it Personal:

Reflect on areas in your life where you can adopt a servant's heart. How can you serve others in your community, workplace, or family?

As we reflect on these teachings of Jesus, let's challenge ourselves to embrace and practice this radical view of greatness and leadership. Serving others selflessly, leading with humility, and putting others first are not just noble ideals; they are the essence of following Christ.

The Challenge

- Group Discussion: Share and discuss what serving others means to your group. Reflect on how Jesus' teachings influence this understanding.
- Review this week's SERVE project goals.

Prayer

Week 1: Understanding Servanthood

SERVE Project Ideas

GENERAL IDEAS

- Clean up or help with new landscaping for a local school
- Host a garage sale to help a family or organization
- Help the elderly, widows, or single parents with minor repairs/house projects

NURSING HOMES

- Let kids make crafts and deliver to residents
- Host an event worship service, game night, etc.
- Deliver flowers or small care packages to residents and eat dinner with them

SPECIAL NEEDS

- Build a wheelchair ramp for a family
- Identify a family with a special-needs child and give parents a day out
- Host a party for residents of a special-needs home

LOCAL HOSPITALS

- Serve free coffee and snacks to staff and those in the ER waiting room
- Provide healthy snacks for chemotherapy patients

LOCAL HOSPITALS (continued)

 Deliver small gifts and care packages to patients and families in the children's wing or NICU

CITY SERVICE

- · Help your city with local projects
- Find ways to thank city officials and service providers
- Contact the city and see how you can help them clean up or touch up some park areas

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- Organize a community trash cleanup
- Take lunch to your local police or fire station
- Wash windows of locally owned businesses

OUTREACH IDEAS

- Serve food to the homeless
- Host a block party for families with food, games, and music
- Hand out gum, popsicles, sunscreen or bottled water at a local park

Scripture Reading for the Week:

- Matthew 22:39
- 1 John 4:7-12
- Philippians 2:1-4

Discussion

As we reflect on what it means to love others, let's turn to the scriptures to guide our understanding and actions. In a world where love is often conditional or self-serving, God's Word calls us to a love that is selfless, humble, and rooted in Christ's example.

Week 2: Cultivating Love for Others

Matthew 22:39: Redefining Greatness

Read the Passage:

"You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Reflection: Jesus presents this commandment as inseparable from loving God. It challenges us to consider how we treat those around us and calls us to extend the same care and concern we have for ourselves to others.

Discussion Questions:

How do we understand 'neighbor' in this context?

In what ways can we practically love our neighbors in our everyday lives?

How does loving our neighbor reflect our love for God?

1 John 4:7-12: Love, Born of God

Read the Passage:

Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God...

Reflection: This passage beautifully articulates that love originates from God and that loving one another is a reflection of knowing God. It reminds us that our ability to love others is a testament to God's love in us.

Discussion Questions:

How does understanding that love comes from God change our perspective on loving others?

In what ways can we demonstrate God's love to those who may not know Him?

Discuss a time when loving someone else helped you understand God's love more deeply.

Philippians 2:1-4: Unity and Humility in Love

Read the Passage:

Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves...

Reflection: Paul urges the believers in Philippi to have a mindset of humility and unity, looking to the interests of others. This mindset is key in serving and loving others effectively.

Discussion Questions:

How can humility enhance our ability to love others?

What are some challenges we face in putting others' interests before our own, and how can we overcome them?

Share an example of a time when unity within a group led to more effective service or support.

Make it Personal:

Reflect on ways you can cultivate love for others in your life. Consider areas where you can show more compassion, kindness, and understanding.

The Challenge

- Group Discussion: Reflect on how the group can demonstrate love for others in practical ways. Share ideas and experiences.
- Review this week's SERVE project goals.

Discussion

Faith is the cornerstone of our relationship with God, but it doesn't stop there. The Bible teaches us that authentic faith is demonstrated through our actions. This week, we'll examine what it means to live out our faith through acts of service and kindness.

James 2:14-17: Faith and Works Go Hand in Hand Read the Passage:

What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works?...

Reflection: James challenges us to reflect on the practicality of our faith. True faith, he argues, is evidenced by the actions it inspires, particularly in meeting the needs of those around us.

Discussion Questions:

What are some ways our faith can motivate us to act?

How does this passage challenge the way you view service and generosity?

Discuss practical steps we can take to ensure our faith is active and not just theoretical.

Galatians 6:9-10: Perseverance in Doing Good

Read the Passage:

And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap...

Reflection: Paul encourages us not to lose heart in doing good, reminding us that our efforts have a purpose and will bear fruit in due time.

Discussion Questions:

How can we maintain enthusiasm and perseverance in serving others?

Discuss the importance of doing good, especially to those who are of the household of faith.

Share a time when you felt discouraged in doing good and how you overcame it.

Week 3: Living Out Faith Through Actions

Hebrews 13:16: Sharing and Doing Good

Read the Passage:

Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

Reflection: This verse reminds us that sharing and doing good are not just acts of human kindness, but they are sacrifices pleasing to God.

Discussion Questions:

In what ways can we share what we have with others?

How does this concept of sacrifice relate to our daily lives and service?

Think of examples where you've seen the joy of sharing in your community or church.

Make it Personal:

Consider how you can better integrate your faith with your actions. Reflect on areas in your life where you can be more active in serving and doing good.

Scripture Reading for the Week:

- Matthew 5:16
- 1 Peter 4:10
- Galatians 5:13

Discussion

Service is more than an act; it's a testament to our faith and a reflection of God's love. This week, we delve into how our service can illuminate the lives of others and glorify God.

Week 4: The Impact of Service

Matthew 5:16: Letting Your Light Shine

Read the Passage:

"In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."

Reflection: Jesus encourages us to live in such a way that our actions point others to God. Our service is a light that can guide others to Him.

Discussion Questions:

How can our service be a testimony to our faith?

Discuss ways in which serving others can shine a light on God's love.

What are some practical ways we can ensure our service glorifies God and not ourselves?

1 Peter 4:10: Serving with Our Gifts

Read the Passage:

As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace.

Reflection: Peter reminds us that our talents and gifts are given by God not for our own benefit, but to serve others and thus serve God.

Discussion Questions:

What gifts or talents do you feel God has given you, and how can you use them to serve?

How does using our gifts in service reflect our stewardship of God's grace?

Share an example of how you or someone you know has used their gifts in service.

Galatians 5:13: Serving in Love

Read the Passage:

For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. **Reflection:** Paul highlights that our freedom in Christ is an opportunity to serve others in love, rather than serving our own desires.

Discussion Questions:

How does serving others demonstrate the freedom we have in Christ?

Discuss the relationship between love and service. How does one influence the other?

Consider ways in which serving others can be an act of love in your community.

Make it Personal:

Reflect on your group's SERVE project, which you may have just completed or are still preparing to complete. How did it impact you and those you served, or how do you anticipate that it will have an impact? Do you see it impacting you and those you serve? What are your hopes and prayers for this project?

The Challenge

- Group Discussion: Discuss the impact or potential impact of the group's service project on both the group members and the beneficiaries.
- Review this week's SERVE project goals. If your project is complete, spend more time on reflection. Otherwise spend this time finalizing project details.

APRIL 28 WEEK 4

- Step 3 Plan Your Project will have been completed OR is scheduled for the coming week.
- Finalize details, if necessary.
- Start your project with prayer, love people, and have fun!
- Post photos on social media and use #cLifeSERVES2024.
- Complete Step 4 Reflect using the "Make it Personal" section of Week 4 materials.

Week 4: The Impact of Service

- Review the service project plan, ensuring everyone understands their role and the timeline.
- Begin to implement the service project, starting with any preparatory tasks that can be done in advance.
- Challenge the group to do some sort of reflection after project is complete if you weren't able to do it today. Maybe something as a family, or possibly posting on social media if they're comfortable.
- Make sure to go over the to-do list for the week. Also, go over the final details for your project. Time, place, supplies, food, etc.
 Make sure everyone knows who is to be where and who is doing what.
